Waste or Not to Waste

Household Food Waste Behaviors and Implications for Food Security and Environmental Sustainability in Sri Lanka National Research Council (2020) Recipients

Food waste is a research topic that deserves attention, given the tremendous amount of food loss worldwide at every stage of the food chain. By identifying research opportunities and proposing methods for assessing the problem, we aim at providing avenues for rigorous and relevant research in the qualitative literature to identify people's underlying motivations and barriers to food household-level food waste behaviors. Once the specific food waste behaviors are identified we will evaluate its relationship with household food security and shed some light on the food waste paradox in the Sri Lankan context.
