- Prepare a short PowerPoint presentation on your post-graduate research to give the audience an understanding of:
 - For ongoing research with completed research components
 - Why did you conduct this research?
 - What methods did you use?
 - What were your key findings and take-home message?
 - For research proposals:
 - Why are you planning this study?
 - What methods will you employ?
 - What are the expected outcomes?

• Guidelines for presentation slide preparation

- Structure
 - Number of slides Maximum 4 PowerPoint slides
 - Slide 1: Title of your research, your name, affiliation, and GRS logo (top right corner)
 - Slide 2: Background and objectives
 - Slide 3: Methods (completed or proposed)
 - Slide 4: Results and conclusion (or expected outcomes for proposals)

Slide design

- Minimize text; use simple figures, flow charts, or images
- Use high-resolution images
- Ensure text is readable Use clear, large font (minimum 20-24 depending on the font)
- Avoid animations
- Maintain a logical flow between slides
- Omit references and acknowledgments

Presentation tips

- o Tell a coherent story with a beginning, middle, and end
- Prepare the slides to support your story
- o Practice well to present within the given 3-minute
- Start with your content; skip personal introductions

• Evaluation criteria

- o Content (40 marks)
 - Background
 - Methods
 - Results/Conclusion or Expected Outcomes
 - Logical sequence
 - Clear, concise slides
- Communication skills (30 marks)
 - Eye contact
 - Body language
 - Audience engagement
 - Clear speech
- Time management (10 marks)
 - Appropriate time allocation for each section
- o Q&A performance (20 marks)
 - Confident and knowledgeable responses
 - Ability to defend your research
