UReS 2024- Guidelines for Abstract Preparation

Title of the Abstract: (Font; 14, bold, Times New Roman, center-aligned**)** should be brief and explain the study reported. Capital letters should be used only for the first word and proper nouns. Abbreviations should not be used.

Authors and Affiliations: The authors' names should be in the form of initials followed by surnames and should be center-aligned. The initials of the authors must be in uppercase letters and indicated before the surname. Each initial should be followed by a full stop without a space. A single space should be placed between the last initial and the surname. Separate names with commas, except for the last name, which should be preceded by the word 'and'. Terminate the author list with a full stop (Font; 12, Times New Roman, center- aligned). Leave a single space between the title and the authors' names. The corresponding author's name should be indicated by an asterisk (*) at the end of the name.

The author affiliation should be in italics and center-aligned. Leave no space between the authors' names and affiliations. If multiple names and addresses exist, they should be identified by superscript numbers (see the template). The email address of the corresponding author should be provided after the affiliations (Font; 12, Times New Roman, left-aligned, italicized). There should be a one-line space between the affiliations and the email address.

Text/Body of the Abstract: Should contain 250-300 words, justified; do not use subheadings such as introduction, material and methods, results, etc.

Keywords: Three to five keywords or phrases in alphabetical order, separated by commas.

No references, tables or figures should be included in the abstract.

Acknowledgements: You can include a brief statement of acknowledgement for any institute, organization, personnel or funding agency that supported your research work.

Language: UK English only.

Non-English terms: All non-English terms should be *italicized*. E.g. *et al., viz, etc, in vivo, Yala, Maha*.



All scientific names should be *italicized*. Both genus and species names should be mentioned at the first appearance and only the species name can be mentioned with abbreviated genus name subsequently.

e.g. Clostridium botulinum and subsequently, C. botulinum.

Software: Microsoft[®] Word (the template has been provided at the end of these guidelines and can be downloaded from the faculty website).

Page setting format:

- **Paper size:** A4 (210 x 297 mm) typed single-sided only.
- Font: Times New Roman
- Line spacing: 1.5
- Text alignment: Justify
- Margins: 2.5 cm (1") on all sides.

Submission:

Abstracts prepared as per the aforementioned guidelines must be shown to the respective supervisor, and the **supervisor corrected abstract** must be submitted via LMS on or before **14**th **March 2025**. Please rename your abstract by your student number and Department (20xxxx_DAF, 20xxxx_DFST) when submitting.

Abstracts that do not comply with these guidelines will be returned to the author and after addressing all the comments, the revised version should be submitted within three working days. Abstracts received late will be rejected.

Accepted abstracts will be published in the symposium proceedings - UReS 2024.
